	AC convened the meeting at 11:30. AC welcomed all present and thanked all for attending.	
2	Staff Items	AC
	AC noted that there seems to be an issue with the mailing list for the Programme Representatives questionnaire sent out to students. Several students did not receive the survey and the Communications team are looking to find out why. AC added that Term 2 was a very different term than expected, with all learning and teaching still taking place digitally. Some changes in the LLiB groups were necessary to accommodate the time differences.	
	AC invited the Programme representatives to share student feedback and reminded them that feedback should be constructive and helpful.

	It was noted that there was a low number of responses to the survey and the views expressed are shared by a small number of students.

	3.2 Foundation English for Academic Purposes 2 Plus	
	 Overall students felt that the course structure was clear, but noted that the course was harder than last Term Some students found the course too slow and difficult to follow The assessments are well-designed and the teacher is helpful 	

• Some students noted that the essay submission date in week 6 clashes with the Spring Festival in China and it is difficult for students to focus

AC responded that it is not possible to arrange assessment dates around holidays such as the Chinese New Year and noted that this would have been less of a problem if students were studying in person in Edinburgh.

3.3 Living and Learning in Britain

The course was clear, although some students found the content and Pebble+ difficult

- Students would like more time to practice writing and clearer feedback on how to improve
- Some students do not know what the assessment criteria are.

AC reminded students that formative work should be submitted regularly and on time so that students can benefit fully from the feedback in preparation for the final submission. It is important that students contact the marker if feedback comments are not clear.

AC added that the marking criteria document is available on Learn under *Assessment* and has been since the start of Term 1.

3.4 Reading English Literature

- Students find the course structure clear and the assessments well-designed
- The teacher and the reading materials are very helpful

3.5 Introduction to Cultural Studies

- Half of those who responded found the course structure confusing and difficult to follow. Some students feel that they need to do some self-study to catch up.
- Students find the reading materials quite challenging

AC noted that the course may feel a bit more difficult in the beginning, but students usually find that it gets easier in the second half of the Team once they are more familiar with the subject matter.

3.6 Introduction to Social Anthropology

- The course feels too slow-paced at times
- Students found the teacher very helpful
- Students would like more varied assessments such as quizzes
- The timed assessment is not clear

AC responded that assessments for all Term 2 course are the same and aim to expose students to assessments that they are likely to encounter in UG study – essays and timed exams. Quizzes are used only in Term 1 to test that students comprehend the subject matter, however, this is not necessary for Term 2 and no changed to Term 2 assessments are planned for now.

3.7 Markets and Crises: The Study of Political Economy

- Students found the course structure clear, but noted that content could be better organised at times
- The teacher is very helpful and well-liked by the class

3.8 Introduction to Politics

• The course materials and not always clear and too much time is spent on certain subjects

	AC asked the Programme Representatives to comment on how students are coping with studying remotely. The programme representatives replied that students are mostly fine and doing their best, but some are struggling with the late hours due to time-zone differences.
