Research

Methodological expertise:

My primary methodological expertise is qualitative, and in particular narrative, discourse and arts-based methodologies. I use these methodologies to open up spaces for the voices of marginalised groups to be heard. I am Assistant Director of the Centre for Creative-Relational Inquiry based at the University of Edinburgh.

I also use quantitative and mixed methods within my work, particularly that focused on workforce.

Research topics:

Workforce: Recent research has focused on the nursing workforce, its development and the retention and support of qualified nurses in practice.
