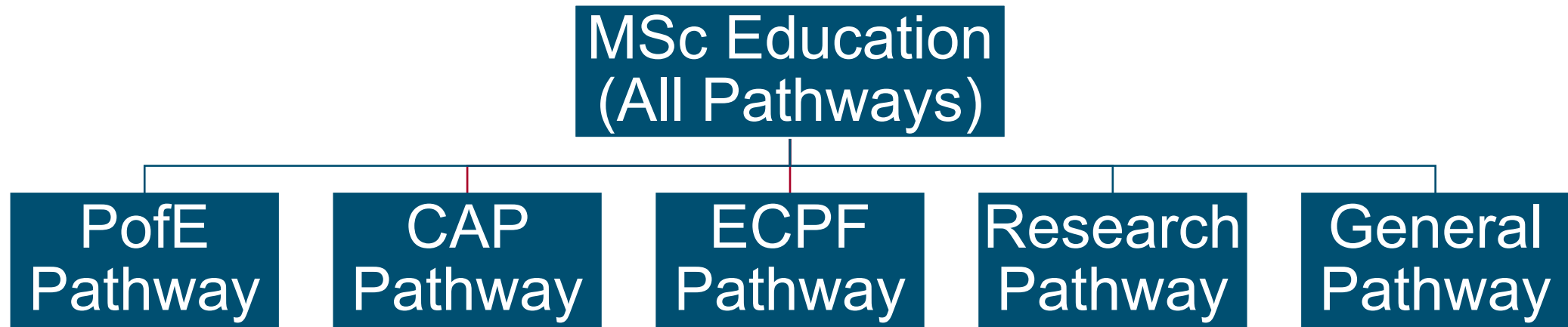


What is a Pathway?

- A sub-group within the overall programme
- Organised around theme (e.g. disciplines and practice)
- Have a set of compulsory courses that reflects your specialism.
- Share courses with other pathways in MSc Education
- Reflected on your certificate of academic award



Five Pathways in MSc Education 24/25



- PoE = Philosophy of Education
- CAP = Child and Adolescent Psychology
- ECPF= Early Childhood Practice and Froebel pathway



Programme Structure

The Sources of Knowledge* (10 credits) S1
Conceptualising Research* (10 credits) S2

Education Policy and the Politics of Education (20 credits) S1
and/or The Philosophy of Education (20 credits) S1

Pathway Compulsory courses (vary by pathway)
Option courses (one of them may be an outside course,
approval required)

In discussion with your supervisor you will decide the focus and design of your study (e.g. empirical research, desk-based research, etc). Regardless of methodological approach, your dissertation will demonstrate an understanding of research design, data collection and analysis, presentation and research ethics.
