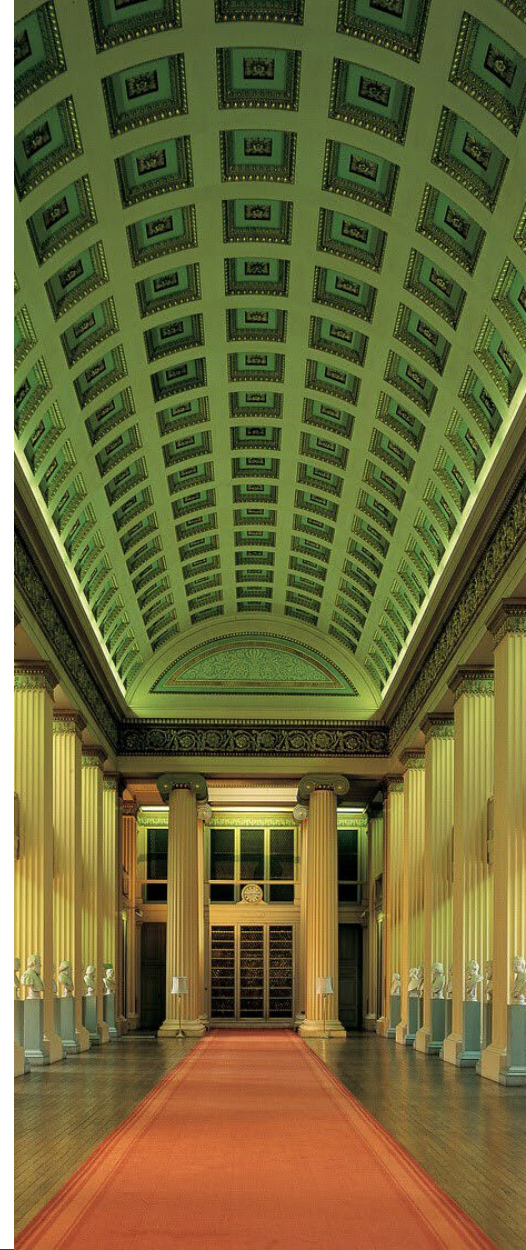

- Join a community of around 100 PhD students
- Demonstration, by thesis and oral examination, of original research making a significant contribution to knowledge
- Supervision by a team of experts in your chosen field of study
- Three-year research training programme
- Opportunities to undertake individual advanced training that is necessary for a particular research project
- Become part of a community of established researchers and benefit from a rich and diverse intellectual environment.



Studying for a PhD at Edinburgh continued

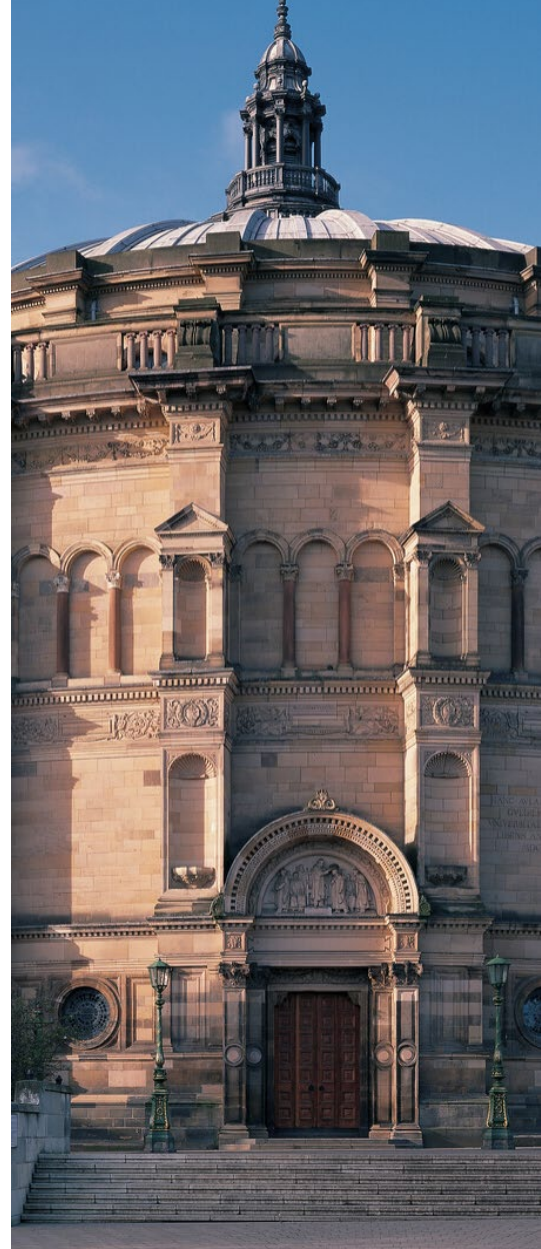
- The first year:
 - Training in scholarship skills
 - Supervisory meetings (at least 2 times per semester– for duration of degree)
 - 1st year presentation
 - 1st year panel
- The second year:
 - Poster/3MT
- The third year:
 - Participate in the 3rd Year Research Showcase



Studying for a PhD at Edinburgh continued

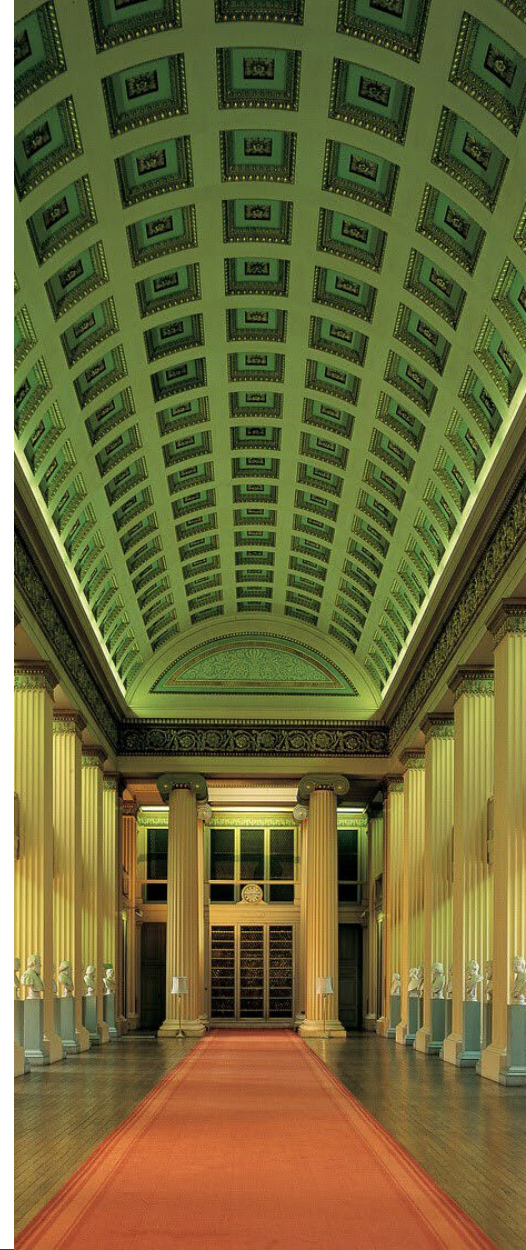
■ Entitlements:

- Laptop loan scheme
- Printing allowance
- Research budget (£800, over 2nd/3rd/4th year)
- Exchange programmes: LERU Programme & KU Leuven
- Participation in trainings:
 - In-house: research skills, methods, writing/publication, writing retreats viva prep
 - IAD: academic skills, time management/ effective research, presentational skills
 - ELE: language and writing courses for non-native speakers



LLM by Research

- Scholarship skills training seminars
- 30 000 word dissertation
- Work independently but under specialist academic supervision
- Stepping stone to Doctoral study
- Opportunity to develop and get feedback on a PhD proposal
- All training opportunities

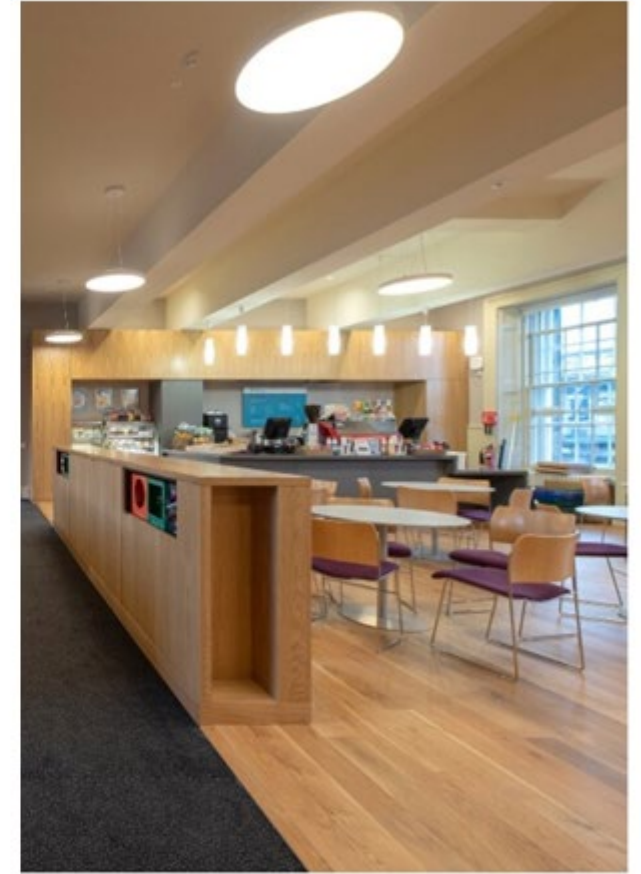
