Courses for the 2024-25 academic year will be announced in May 2025.








### Dissertation (60 credits)


- Approved topic based on a subject you have studied in one of your courses during the programme
- 10,000 words
- Written between April-August
- Structured supervision to support your independent scholarly research
- An excellent foundation for doctoral research





### How you will learn

- Weekly two-hour interactive seminars per semester for each subject
- Active participation in discussions and advance reading expected
- Classes may also involve lectures, class debates, individual presentations, or group exercises for example.
- No exams
- Courses use a range of take-home assessments (e.g. essays, reports) or in-class work (oral presentations, class participation).





### Career opportunities

Graduates of our LLM in Law programme go on to develop dynamic careers in academia, legal professions, national and international institutions, academic research, and beyond.

The most recent Destinations of Leavers Education (DLHE) survey data we have is for those who graduated in November 2017:

- 94% of those available and who responded to the survey were working or studying six months after completing the programme
- Of those, 95% were in highly skilled employment or further study
- Of those working, 94% were in highly skilled employment.
