




#### Courses continued

Select between 20 and 80 credits from the following:

- Company Law (40 credits)
- Insolvency Law (20 credits)
- Applied Corporate Law (20 credits)

There is also the option to take between 0 and 60 credits from other courses in the Commercial law subject area (e.g. finance, banking, commercial law, or contract law courses), or different subject areas offered by the Law School, depending on availability.








#### Dissertation (60 credits)

- Written between April-August
- Structured supervision to support your independent scholarly research
- An excellent foundation for doctoral research




