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### Our Programme – since 2010, more than 350 graduates

- PG Certificate 60 credits, takes 1 2 years, 3 compulsory core courses
- PG Diploma 120 credits, takes 2 4 years, 6 of 25 elective courses
- MSc 180 credits, takes 3 6 years, choose 'traditional' research project OR 'alternative' route
- PG Professional Development 10 to 50 credits taken over 2 years max, selection of courses
- Intermittent (ICL) study option pay course by course and up to 6 years to complete full MSc
- Summer School (usually every 2 years, not credit-bearing)
- Degree Programme Timetable: <u>DPT: Biodiversity, Wildlife and Ecosystem Health (Online Learning) (MSc) (Part-time) (PTMSCBIOWE1P) (ed.ac.uk)</u>





## How to Choose?

- PG Certificate? Cost-effective, cumulative, progressive pathway through designated academic skills & content
- Ideal for those with non-biological academic backgrounds and those wanting to change direction

#### Courses

- Evolution and Biodiversity
- Ecosystem Health and Sustainability
- Environmental Ethics and Governance
- Use a cohesive assessment strategy to enable students to progressively develop a range of foundational graduate and professional skills and competencies
- Encapsulates set of meaningful learning outcomes within each course, that are also aligned with the overall programme 'identity'





## How to Choose?

- PG Diploma? Build subject learning with tailored choice of extensive choice of elective courses ideal for those who don't need/want research element
  - Including invasive species, wildlife trade, climate change, food security, genetics, behavioural ecology, One Health, communication, leadership, social science, finance, and psychology
- MSc? Opportunity to undertake independent research through 'traditional' or 'alternative' route
   – ideal for those seeking advanced, specialist research training and need higher qualification
- PG Prof Dev? aimed at working professionals to advance knowledge through postgraduate-level course without time/need for PGCert/Dip

- UG degree 2:1 or equivalent
- Work/field/volunteer experience
- References (academic/non-academic)
- English language requirements

## Fees and Funding

- Fees paid yearly, in instalments if preferred
- Can pay by course (intermittent study route)
  - Fees for 2025-26:
    - Full year = £6,370
    - 10 credit course = £1,065
    - 20 credit course = £2,125
- Fees fixed in line with first year of study (part-time mode)
- MSc Total (starting Sep 2025, study for 3 years) = £19,100

## Overall programme satisfaction very high

- Programme chosen because online and offered flexibility
- No feeling online programme disadvantaged career progression
- Subject knowledge, applied knowledge and life-long skills contributed most to career
- Valued interacting with a greater diversity of students than in-person
- >70% found discussion boards positive contribution to community and learning
- > 90% of summer school attendees positive contribution to feeling of community
