 - The Philosophy department at Edinburgh is one of the largest in the UK, bringing together 42 world-class researchers approaching the study of epistemology, ethics, logic and language, mind and cognition, religion and science, and the history of philosophy.



MSc Epistemology, Ethics & Mind

This online MSc in Epistemology, Ethics and Mind is a unique programme which provides a thorough grounding in contemporary philosophy, with a particular emphasis on those core research areas where Edinburgh has particular strengths: epistemology, ethics, and philosophy of mind and cognitive science.







The programme reflects the internationally renowned research in philosophy that is conducted at the University of Edinburgh. No other research-intensive Department of Philosophy anywhere in the world runs an online MSc programme which is focused on these core areas of philosophy.

You will be able to choose from a range of option courses to tailor your programme to develop your own specialised interest, under the expert guidance of our distinguished academics.





The online programmes offer three options depending on what best suits your needs:

- The MSc either full-time (one year) or part time (between two and four years). 180 credits.
- The Diploma either full-time (9 months) or part time (between two and four years). 120 credits.
- The Postgraduate Certificate part time (between one and two years). 60 credits.

Part-time students take a minimum of 20 and a maximum of 60 credits per semester.



Learning Outcomes

- Provide students with a broad knowledge of contemporary philosophical work in epistemology, ethics, and philosophy of mind & cognitive science.
- Provide a basis for advanced research in philosophy, e.g. PhD. level.
- Provide a broad grounding in philosophical research methods.
- Develop analytic skills that can be applied to any field or career.

Programme structure - MSc

Duration: Full-time study: 1 year

Part-time study: 2 – 4 years

Structure: 120 credits taught courses (6 x 20 credit courses)
60 credit independent dissertation







Programme dissertation

Dissertation (8,000 words, 60 credits):

- Involves conducting research into your chosen area of interest
- The dissertation is written once you have completed your 120 credits of taught courses. Full-time students write over the summer; part-time students can choose when to write their project, within a year of completing their taught courses.
- The dissertation is one of the key elements that potential PhD supervisors will evaluate.
- Several dissertations have led to publications
