The research aims are to induce to look at specific areas of the brain and how they are affected, the committee noted threshold limits for these and requested information on adverse effects. Noted that the NACWO has almost 30 years experience working with the animals will be trained to remain still in the MRI, however if the animals cannot be trained then the focus will shift to sedation.

- What about considering the mobile MRI truck for the studies? Perhaps we could consider this and it would be much less stressful for the animals.
- Why would it not be possible to sedate/anaesthetize all animals, this would mean a more consistent approach?
- Is there any evidence that animals are stressed during transport? Can it be confirmed that the animals are not stressed, what is the evidence for this?

•	Black start: power was lost for 40seconds then generator activated. Lighting issue: Lights remained on during a study when they should have been off. All lights were on within the facility and had been on continuously for a period from the Friday to the Tuesday. Unlikely welfare issues that light monitoring can be checked, noted that lighting is not covered by the BMS. One member of staff (junior tech) leaving end of May. NACWO refresher training completed. study completed and study ongoing awaiting further updates. 2: due to current Uni finances, will be put on hold for a year. Funding however has been provided by BBSRC so a case has been put into Estates to explain that we cannot use this funding and the new work needs to be completed. At this stage unknown if the work will be completed, this will have issues as is at end of life. Considered that a letter of support from AWERB would be helpful.
