#### **Updates to the AWERB:**

#### 4. Director report

- AWERB training will be trialled in September/October
- We are organising May 2026 LERU meeting.
- We're also organising a Scotland-wide 3Rs meeting directly after the LERU meeting.
- A new European database on replacement will be made available to everyone in September this year

#### 5. Deputy Director report (Facilities)

- Change in NACWOs coming up, this will mostly impact
   A face-to-face forum has been arranged for late June/early July to explain the changes to stakeholders
- is also experiencing staff changes. Two replacement grade 4 posts will be advertised soon.
- refurbishment is going ahead, with the design team and some researchers.

#### 6. NVS update to the committee

Seven SC18s submitted since last meeting, all have been dealt with as appropriate.

#### 7. NACWO update to the committee

 A meeting is being arranged to try and increase the consistency of non-aversive handling training, and non-aversive handling will shortly be included in our ScotPIL training.

#### 8. NTCO update to the committee

- Since the roadshow a number of people have responded regarding their training/competency
  in breeding of GA animals. The audit of training records continues, and will likely pick up more
  people who need to ensure their training is up-to-date.
- Our are due to be reaccredited this Summer. We're working with university to update our ethics module.
- We'll be adding non-aversive handling e-learning to our training.

#### 9. HOLC update to the committee

- AWERBs have been very busy since the start of the year, we're already seeing the benefits of
  that, with no delayed licences since last year. Some licences have even been granted up to 5
  months ahead of time, showing how hard it can be to get the timing right.
- All the July licences that were expiring are now granted and in place.
- Inspector has emailed to praise the quality of the licence that had been sent, in general we do send high quality applications.
- One application was granted with no comments at all, which is highly unusual.
- HOLTIF meeting planned for 9<sup>th</sup> June (HOLC has joined organising committee). ASRU have not confirmed attendance at this meeting yet

#### 10. Deputy Director report (Home Office and Vets)

- Poultry facility closing by the end of July. Some lines will be moving to another facility.

Poultry: no changes in breeding of GA lines increased numbers were used in a commercial setting and then released from the Act ie they weren't killed.

CW: Conversation about importing ZF since regulations were updated last September. Government response to protests has not been helpful.
