3. Presentations to the committee:
1, Additional availability project licence PL19-25 BR The committee heard a short presentation on a renewal application related to disease challenges of salmonids, noted that the project licence at Roslin will be protocols 4 and 5, both will need continued authority for the
Protocols 6 and 7 will focus on testing and will occur at a separate establishment these will not be used at
A number of husbandry issues were discussed by the applicant including potential damage to fish via handling, this also mentioned measures to avoid and ameliorate these adverse effects.  Noted that monitoring is intensive and fish are monitored typically 4 times daily, where possible video monitoring will be used (not all facilities). Other potential adverse effects noted are skin ulceration issues and again regular monitoring is included in order to prevent this.
Questions to the applicant:
Are the exp models well established so that predictable harms are noted? Most models are well

understood and mortality rates detailed.

- Some concerns noted on the mortality limits however noted the extensive wealth of experience of the applicant in relation to experience and monitoring.
- The main issues are to ensure that there is appropriate monitoring in place in relation to protocols 4 and 5.
- Approval subject to final sub-committee and final AWERB approval.

• Can it be clarified if all pathogens are currently known in relation

cases where not fully understood a severe severity limit will be applied.

### 2. Presentation :TC

The committee heard a very interesting presentation from on his proposed amendment A23-25. Changes include revision to include a new protocol to look at the impact of immunization on exposure. The other part of the amendment will add blood sampling to an original amendment to use oxytetracycline (already approved)

The 3rd part of the amendment is to establish infection using a natural model of infection (as opposed to injection), this is a very straightforward procedure and it works very well in cattle.

A further minor point is to add an organic solvent to the skin (alcohol) to determine whether this affects attachment or delays it.

#### Questions

- Some discussion related to funding as there is some uncertainty on this, however this work could still be needed for other aspects of the PPL. Noted that other aspects of the protocol will still occur and no additional animals are required. In terms of harm benefit the harms are not likely to be increased.
- Vaccination studies: how long will circulating antibodies persist? Noted that this is a very unusual
  vaccine and there are some issues associated with this in terms of length of immunity which was
  very short.
- Funding is available for the work and noted that these cannot infect humans.
