## Aquaculture Facility:

- Staffing level remain good, with aquatics Team continuing to be trained in the AGRF aquaria maintenance.
- Some additional upgrades to the egg incubators are now required.
- The current salmon study will be to examine IVF; future studies will repeat the GE (disease resistance) salmon, with the planned shipment at the eyed-staged for disease challenged at TBC.
- Wild-type salmon muscle study has been extended again with additional sample timepoints in June and July. Currently the facility houses a small number (13 fish) of salmon (35-40g), with a request for a further 20 more fish (35-50g); delivery TBC.
