Summary of advice submitted to applicant

•	The committee noted that there is currently no literature/evidence to support the feasibility of

	ith significant surgical interventions. Additional information on the criteria
	used to assess whether the animals can be recovered and likely intensive care required upon
	recovery should be provided.
•	The committee suggested that a pilot study approach should be adopted in the first instance,
	commencing . This approach could be used to assess
	suitability of data at this time point as well as inform the need for longer periods of anaesthesia.
	If initial pilot studies are successful then a step-wise approach could be
	followed.
•	The committee asked to confirm that shorter) timepoints would provide useable
	data to address the scientific objectives as stated in the PPL.

- The committee also asked if additional justification could be provided for the need for longer periods of anaesthesia, for example what additional scientific benefit would be gained from these approaches?
- Funding it was noted that current funding is through the charitable and grant fund related sources in addition to short term funding from a number of local charities. In terms of the harms-benefit assessment it is be important to emphasise the likelihood of future funding to reassure the Home Office of the likelihood that the work will be completed. In this section additional examples and assurances would be very helpful. The committee also advised to consider removal of work that is unlikely to be funded within the first half of the duration of the PPL and apply for amendments at later stages.
- Recovery Assessment noted that this is currently quite complex and it was suggested that a simplified version to bring together assessments that would definitely be done in every recovery protocol is provided
