

# **EUSA Referendum – Ethical Electronic Procurement**

In this semester's EUSA Referendum students from the society People and Planet submitted the following question to be voted upon by the student body:

"Should EUSA investigate their supply chains for all procurement of electronics to ensure that worker's rights are maintained throughout, and publish the findings online?"

Students subsequently voted in favour of this motion and as such I have been taking this forward.

The first step involved investigation, where it was quickly determined that EUSA procures its electronic equipment through the Advanced Procurement for Universities and Colleges (APUC) Purchasing Consortium. As such, it is not possible for EUSA to conduct an exhaustive investigation into its supply chains. Therefore, after consultation with the students who proposed this question, EUSA has begun a process of representation to the University's Procurement Office with a view towards raising awareness of ethical electronic procurement and highlighting the ongoing development of an 'electronic Workers' Rights Consortium' with funding from the European Commission.

This project is not yet ready for delivery and therefore, in the meantime, EUSA will be seeking a partnership approach towards implementing ethical electronic procurement with the University. Towards this end, EUSA representatives, along with University representatives, shall be attending an initial meeting in Aberdeen on the 4th to seek to influence a code of practice for APUC.

Electronic procurement is rapidly becoming an area of reputational risk, and EUSA looks forward towards engaging with the University to assist in the mitigation of this risk. We are particularly excited for the roll-out of the new 'eWRC' and shall be engaging with the University closer to the expected delivery time, which is in a few years.
