•	Farms Some issues with drainage and water freezing at the relation to Work has been very busy within the facilities. A ministerial visit occurred last week and was very successful.
•	Some pecking in a broiler model, now improved by reducing numbers and dimming lights within the facility.  Cryopreservation work is underway, with specific lines earmarked for preservation in this way.  health screens submitted, building work is nearing completion.  Chick embryo room (no issues raised)
	Aquaculture Facility (  A new member of staff has been recruited.  Studies: whilst a new (internal) grant holder anticipates starting two new studies in 2023, the potential for space to be outsourced to external companies may also be explored.  Replacement PPL holder: a new chair has been appointed (fish immunologist) who will be in post later this year. It is anticipated that individual will relieve of his role as PPL holder. However it is acknowledged that the aims of the work and the licence may also change in the future.  If future strategy determines the need for this, issues in relation to visualizing disease challenge phenotypes in the facility will need to be addressed.
