Students under the age of 26 can purchase an ImagineR Pass. This annual or monthly pass allows travel across Paris by bus, metro or train. Mature students can purchase a (more expensive) Navigo pass. Imagine R student travel pass RATP
Ecole du Louvre does not provide student accommodation itself, but all exchange students in France can apply for accommodation through the CROUS, a national organisation that manages student halls. Résidences CROUS proche Ecole du Louvre - Paris 1er arrondissement (location-etudiant.fr) CROUS accommodation requires a guarantor. Students under the age of 30 can apply to the free government guarantor service (Visale). Students aged 30 or over will require a guarantor who is resident in France.
Please note that finding accommodation in Paris has been very challenging for UoE exchange students in the past and you should take this into consideration when applying to study at Ecole du Louvre
Visiting students must register with French social security. Registering to social security Campus France All students should apply for a GHIC or EHIC card before travelling.
Students should contact the relevant consulate / embassy to check if they will require a visa and a residence permit to study in France. Accueil - France-Visas
