Insurance	Students must present adequate medical coverage for their stay in Spain, in accordance with current regulations of their place of residence and / or the Spanish Consulate or Embassy where they apply for their visa. In addition, it is compulsory to have travel and accident insurance before arrival at the University of Córdoba. Incoming students can obtain the same insurance coverage that the University of Córdoba
	offers its own students, which is private but has a special price (approximately EUR 19).
	Other travel and accident insurance with equivalent coverage may also be accepted and must equally be presented.
	It is also highly recommended for all EU citizens to obtain the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or Global Health Insurance Card (GHIC) before their arrival.
