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A QUICK GUIDE TO CHOOSING YOUR COURSE PREFERENCES

This booklet lists courses in Schedules A-Q, T, W-Y and should be used in conjunction with your [Degree Programme Table](#), which will lay out how many credits you can take from these Schedules in your year of study.

It's important you consult your [Degree Programme Table](#) when completing your course preferences. Below is a summary of what collections might be included on your [Degree Programme Table](#).

COMPULSORY COURSES

Some programmes include compulsory courses. These will be listed first on your [Degree Programme Table](#) and you will automatically be enrolled on these courses when your record rolls over (those going into Year 2) or is created (those starting in Year 1).

CORE COURSES

Core courses are a collection of courses relevant to your degree programme. You will need to take a certain number of credits from these courses to meet your degree requirements. In some instances there is also a limit to how many courses you can take from the core course offerings. On Joint programmes, these will include courses from both halves of your degree.

OUTSIDE ELECTIVES

Finally, your Degree Programme Table will indicate how many credits you can take as outside electives. Occasionally, this will be indicated as simply a certain number of credits from Schedules A-Q, T, W-Y. On some programmes, there may be a collection of outside courses listed as part of this. These are outside courses that are particularly popular and/or relevant to students on your degree programme.

You may be asked to select a number of preferences from outside electives in each semester. We ask for this many as your credits need to be balanced over each semester (60 credits in each) and the balance will be affected by your core course allocations. As a result, we need sufficient preferences from each semester to cover all eventualities including any potential timetable clashes. In addition, priority for spaces is given to students where the course is core to their programme and it can be more difficult to find spaces on outside electives. Whilst we will try to secure a space for you on your highest preferences, this is not always possible, so it is helpful to have several options to work with. If you are disappointed with your eventual enrolments, spaces may become available on courses and you will be able to request course swaps up until the end of Week 2 of semester.

PRE-REQUISITES, CO-REQUISITES AND PROHIBITED COMBINATIONS

Where it is indicated the course has entry requirements, this means you will need to have one or more of the following:

- Have passed a certain course(s) in your previous year of study (Pre-requisites)
- Be taking another related course(s) in your current year of study (Co-requisites)
- Have not/are not taking a prohibited combination. A prohibited combination are courses that usually share similar material and so cannot be taken together. This includes having taken one of the courses in a previous year of study.

See the course details on DRPS for further information of what is required.

YEAR 1 AND YEAR 2 COURSES

This booklet lists both Year 1 and Year 2 courses. Ordinarily, those going into Year 2 can take either Year 1 or Year 2 courses as part of their outside electives. Year 1 students, however, can only take Year 1 courses unless otherwise stated on DRPS.
