Veterinary Studies at the University of Edinburgh in partnership with South China Agricultural University

South China Agricultural University students who successfully complete two years of study on the SCAU Veterinary Medicine programme are eligible to apply to the four-year Graduate Entry Bachelor of Veterinary Medicine and Surgery programme (BVM&S) offered by the Royal (Dick) School of Veterinary Studies.

Students successfully completing the BVM&S via this pathway will graduate with an internationally accredited degree in a combined total of six years and receive a qualification from both SCAU and the University of Edinburgh.

To be eligible to apply, you must be at least in your second year of study at SCAU, achieving good grades, and be on track to have an overall GPA of 3.4 or above (on a 4 point scale) at the end of your second year.

We also look for evidence of relevant animal handling experience.

Provided you meet these criteria, and subsequent to application, you will be invited to attend an interview in December - February. You will be informed about the outcome of your interview and overall application by the end of March.

If you are offered a place, it will be conditional upon the following:

- Achievement of an overall GPA of 3.4 or above (on a 4 point scale) at the end of your second year
- Passing all of the science modules which make up the first years of your programme
- Meeting our English language requirements (if applicable)
- Payment of a deposit of £1,500 which will be deducted from your first year's tuition fee (refundable in the event that you fail to meet any of the other above offer conditions)

The University of Edinburgh reserves the right to make final judgement on the admissibility of each applicant.

How to Apply



1. Complete a free online application form
2. Provide the following additional documents by email:
 - An up-to-date academic transcript from SCAU
 - A reference from a SCAU academic (can be submitted directly by the referee)
 - A summary of your educational background, including any English Language tests achieved to date (if applicable)
 - A personal statement of up to 500 words
3. Complete an online Work Experience Summary form

Things to bear in mind...

Work Experience

We do not request specific types of work experience or state days/weeks required, as it depends to some extent on the opportunities available to you. The broader your experience the better, but you should not gain experience to the detriment of your academic studies. You should, however, gain both veterinary practice and animal work experience.

Non-Academic Achievements and Interests

Your personal statement and references give us an idea of your skills, achievements and motivation, which are important factors in assessing your application. This could feature:

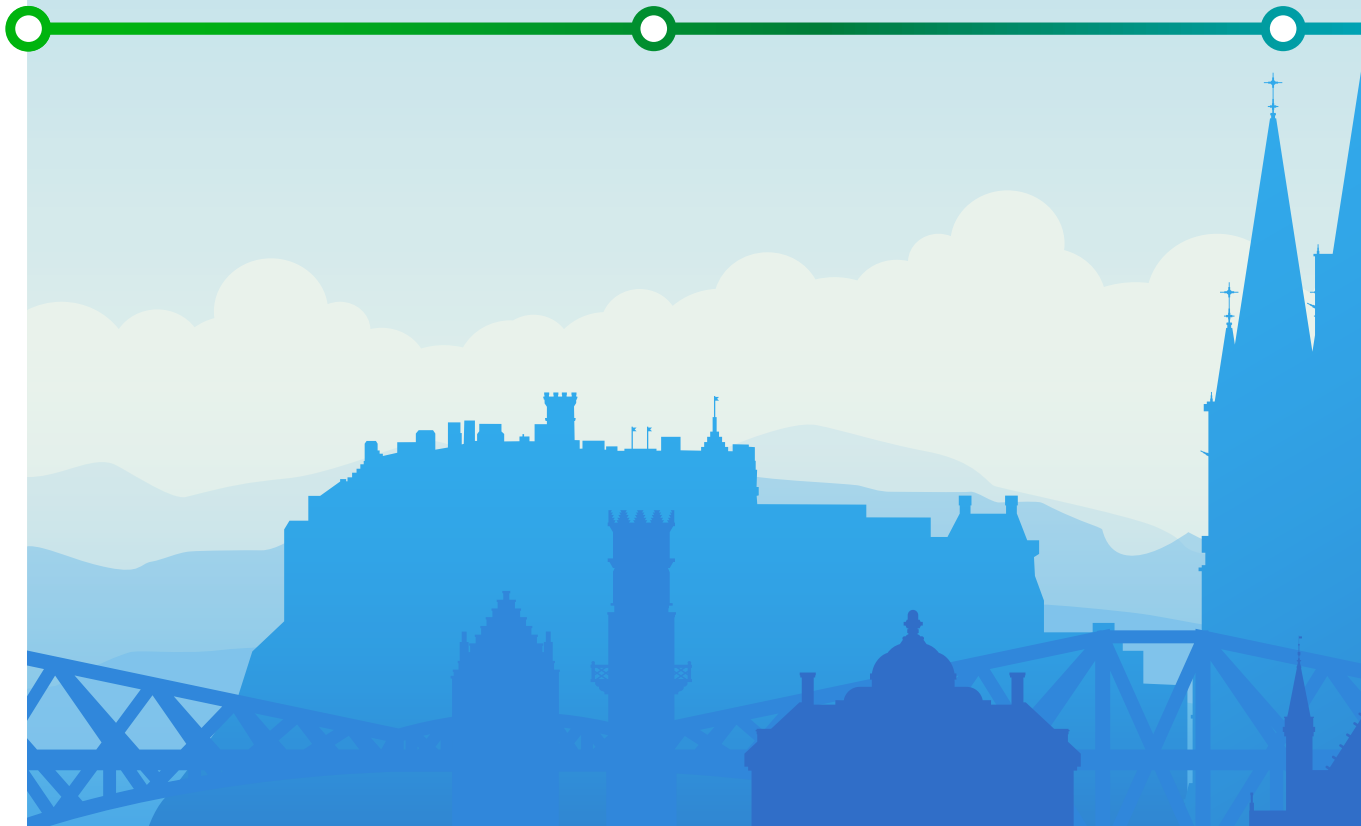
- Social involvement
