- **W** VERY HIGH OR LOW TEMPERATURE
- **UNCONTROLLED SHIVERING**
- **CONFUSION**
- **COLD OR BLOTCHY HANDS AND FEET**
- NOT PASSING AS MUCH URINE AS NORMAL

1 Nov	Sore throat
2 Nov	Cold/flu-like symptoms
3 Nov (am)	GP appointment: suspected viral throat infection
3 Nov (pm)	Vomiting Diarrhoea
6 Nov (pm)	Call to NHS 24
6 Nov (late pm)	Sharp pain in right side of chest, unable to take a full breath, 116 bpm lying in bed Call to NHS 24 Out of Hours GP appointment Transfer to Emergency Department

severe pneumonia

invasive ventilation

CT scan of chest

Lemierre's syndrome

(fusobacterium necrophorum)

thrombocytopenia

VTE prophylaxis

inotropic support

CT head

acute kidney injury

left-sided empyema

re-admission to ICU with confusion,

dilated pupils and tachypnoea

broad spectrum antibiotics

(Serotonin syndrome?)

right-sided peripheral lung abscess

fluid resuscitation

respiratory failure

left-sided VATS procedure with chest drains

hepatosplenomegaly

severe sepsis

7 Nov	Admitted to ICU from Emergency Department and put on a ventilator
12 Nov	Chest drain
16 Nov	Surgery
18 Nov	Extubated
19 Nov	Transferred to Cardiothoracic HDU
21 Nov	Readmitted to ICU and put on a ventilator
23 Nov	Extubated
25 Nov	Discharged to cardiothoracic ward
5 Dec	Discharged from hospital
