## Cycling

Cycling is often the quickest way to travel and it's great for the environment and your health.

There are many traffic-free cycle paths and Quiet Routes (QR) to explore – QR6 takes you from Central Area to King's Buildings.

The University supports cycling by offering:

- Bike parking, shower facilities and emergency bike repair kits at every campus
- Free bike maintenance from Dr Bike
- Led bike rides
- A Cycle to Work Scheme for staff
- A Bike Buddy scheme that lets you ride alongside experienced cyclists

## Public Transport

KB is well connected to the city by bus – Lothian services 41, 42, 67 provide direct connections to the city centre, and the Cameron Toll Shopping Centre is just a 10-minute walk away, where a large number of bus services can be accessed.

From 18:30 on weekdays students and staff can travel on Service 41 for the reduced cash only fare of £1. This offer is only available from the Potterrow and KB bus stops.

## Driving

If you need to drive, consider:

- Car sharing using the University's Tripshare scheme
- Going electric – the University provides charge points outside the Ashworth Building and in KB Square
- Using Park & Ride – facilities are provided close to the city by-pass with high frequency bus services
- Hiring a car using Enterprise Car Club. The scheme has vehicles around the city, for short term rentals

Parking is available at locations across the campus but is limited and requires a permit.

King's Buildings (KB) campus occupies a leafy 35 hectare site around 2 miles south of the city centre and the University's Central Area campus.

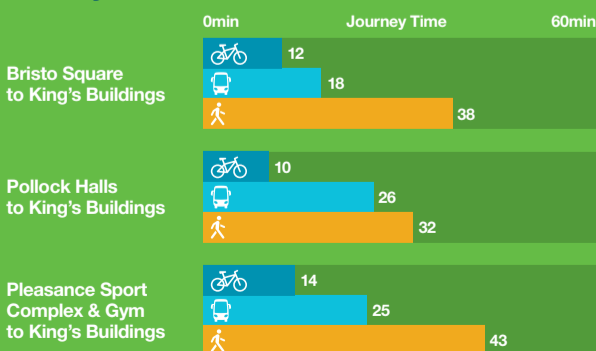
