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What is teaching sustainability and why is it important?

Teaching and Learning can develop individuals' knowledge, skills and values needed to act sustainably for the environment, society, and the economy. Universities must urgently adapt how and what we teach to enable the large-scale behaviour change needed for a safe and socially just world.
