#### FURTHER PARTICULARS

The College of Humanities & Social Science seeks to appoint a Director for the recently-established Centre for Contemporary Latin American Studies. The 0.2FTE position is available on a secondment basis for existing academic staff of the University of Edinburgh, from any disciplinary background, with research and teaching interests in Latin American Studies. The post is available for an initial three-year period. It is hoped that the appointee will be able to take up duties from 1 August 2013. The Director will be expected to help complete the establishment of the Centre and to lead and develop its activities, especially in recruiting, teaching and supervising postgraduate students, the formulation of projects for research-funding, and the organisation of conferences and other outreach activities. The Director will also contribute to the development and teaching of the MSc in Contemporary Latin American Studies and other courses and programmes associated with the Centre.

Applicants should have an international profile in research, proven expertise in teaching and supervising postgraduate students, experience in effective academic leadership and a record of success in applying for external research funding. Applications are welcome from scholars in any discipline area relevant to the Centre.

# THE CENTRE FOR CONTEMPORARY LATIN AMERICAN STUDIES

Our vision for the Centre for Contemporary Latin American Studies is threefold. It will be a:

- dynamic centre in academic and cultural terms, focusing and enhancing Edinburgh's existing offering by bringing leading Latin American scholars and professionals from a number of fields to the United Kingdom;
- take on a leadership role for the study and understanding of Latin America within Scotland and beyond, both in terms of the postgraduate student body and in terms of the wider public; and
- become Britain's prime nexus for Latin American firms developing internationally, particularly in Scotland, Britain and Europe and vice versa, and for Scottish based firms developing in Latin America.

This ambitious project aims to draw together and enhance the already rich resources across the University dedicated to interdisciplinary research into contemporary Latin America, its cultures and societies, history, economics, trade and industry, politics, environment, architecture, law, scientific, creative and technological contributions.

The Centre will:

- recognise the significance of Latin America as an economic and cultural power, and afford it a proportionate and fitting academic profile at the University;
- enhance the academic discipline of Latin American Studies in a variety of subject areas;
- support the practical development of business and trade between Scotland, the wider UK, and Latin American Countries;
- create innovative interdisciplinary research and teaching;
- host a programmes of events and workshops; and
- help facilitate networking and trade missions.

This represents an initial outline of how the new Centre could be shaped. It is likely that the scope and focus of the Centre will evolve and develop over time in line with University priorities, external demands and the input of the Director and the other staff associated with the Centre.
