


Facts and Figures

Introducing Student Recruitment & Admissions

Student Recruitment and Admissions (SRA) aims to:

- raise awareness of the University of Edinburgh;
- provide a professional information and advice service to prospective UK and EU applicants, and their advisers, to enable them to make informed choices about higher education.

We recognise the important role that parents, teachers and other advisers play in the decision-making process, and deliver information and events tailored to support their needs.

SRA also plays an important role in coordinating and supporting recruitment and admissions activity across the University - at both undergraduate and postgraduate level.

This leaflet provides information about the services that SRA provides to all prospective undergraduate and postgraduate students, and their advisers. Services for Prospective Applicants

SRA enables potential students and their advisers to find out about the opportunities available at the University of Edinburgh, by:

- attending regional and school-based higher education conventions across the UK and EU, to meet with and advise potential students on a one-to-one basis;
- organising a range of different visiting opportunities for potential students including: three undergraduate and one postgraduate Open Day per year; student-led campus tours every Monday and Friday; and downloadable web resources enabling visitors to choose their own time to visit;
- providing individual advice and guidance to prospective students and their advisers by phone and email;
- producing a range of publications and web resources for prospective students and advisers available via the University website, at outreach events, and directly from the SRA office in Edinburgh.

Services for Parents

- SRA take part in many parents' evenings organised by schools across Scotland every year, and also arrange on-campus events for parents of local applicants who have received an offer.

Services for Teachers & Advisers

SRA offers a range of services to guidance and careers staff to support them in their roles, including training sessions on key issues such as UCAS applications, personal statements and reference writing.
